Our commitment to building an inclusive talent pipeline is stronger than ever, alongside our work on the mainstage. Through our flagship initiative Taking Part, we have fostered long-lasting relationships with the communities of Southwark and Lambeth for over 27 years. Every year, we connect with more than 15,000 individuals—offering free tickets, workshops, and opportunities that empower people of all ages to express themselves and grow through theatre. Our Creators Program is the only scheme of its kind, developing new opportunities and pathways for emerging theatre artists and supporting up to 3,000 individuals annually.

Under the leadership of Kwame Kwei-Armah, we've seen the development of groundbreaking productions such as Passing Strange, Nachtland, The Homecoming, and A Face in the Crowd. As Kwame stepped down after his final production, we thank him for his leadership and look forward to welcoming Nadia Fall, who will bring her artistic vision as Artistic Director from January 2025.



### Young Vic

#### **NACHTLAND**

Tony Award-winner Patrick Marber (Leopoldstadt) directed a jagged new satire by one of Germany's foremost playwrights.

This dark comedy offers a gripping exploration of memory, trauma, and the enduring impact of history, exemplifying the Young Vic's commitment to brave and bold storytelling. A striking fusion of sharp satire and complex themes.

#### **PASSING STRANGE**

The European premiere of the Tony Award-winning rock musical Passing Strange, directed by Liesl Tommy, tells the story of a young Black musician's search for identity, swapping his middle-class L.A. upbringing for punk rock and protest in 1980s Amsterdam and Berlin.






### TAKING PART Empowering Communities Through Theatre

Taking Part is the Young Vic's core community engagement initiative, providing free, creative opportunities for over 15,000 participants annually. Focused on supporting our local communities of Lambeth and Southwark, and those who have been historically underserved by the arts, the program fosters self-expression, education and empowerment.





### **Taking Part – Key Milestones**

#### **Learning & Participation Programmes**

Our Taking Part department offers lifelong opportunities to engage with the Young Vic, beginning with the Learning Strand for young people at school age, continuing through adolescence with the Participation Strand, and extending into adulthood with Neighbourhood Theatre for ages 25 and up.


The Learning Strand provides creative engagement within Lambeth and Southwark schools and alternative provisions, including free tickets, bespoke projects, workshops and mentorship. It equips young people with skills and confidence to pursue careers in the creative industries and serves as a gateway to advanced programmes.

The Participation Strand offers creative projects and productions for young people interested in developing new skills or exploring the theatre industry.

#### **Young Associates**


Our Young Associates Programme is now its it's 11th year running! We are committed to facilitating meaningful ways to work in the creative and cultural industries for young people in our local boroughs of Lambeth and Southwark.

A key part of that commitment is our Young Associates Programme, which employs a group of local young people aged 18-25 to work across our organisation each year. We actively encourage people from a variety of backgrounds with different experiences, skills and stories to join us and influence and develop our working practice. During the 9-month programme they will: gain hands-on experience as a Young Vic staff member; participate in an international cultural exchange; and create and produce a project of their own.

### MANTELPEACE

### **Taking Part – Key Milestones**

This summer, we produced an immersive exhibition MANTELPEACE.

MANTELPEACE draws on real-life experiences of young men in Southwark and Lambeth.

We worked with Lead Artist Adam Karim, Sound Designer and Composer Duramaney Kamara, Set Designer Finlay Jenner and Guest Artists Ivan Oyik, Kingsley Nebechi, Marc Pouani, Still Shadey and Wumi Olaosebikan.

The contributions to our exhibition were made by our Learning Contributors Arco Academy, Lansdowne School, Southwark Inclusive Learning Service and Untold Creative Training who worked with our Lead Artist and Guest Artists to explore our theme of the transition from boyhood to manhood.

Our exhibition provides a fresh perspective on traditional masculinity.

Alongside the creating, we worked with 8 local Young Curators and Consultants on a paid programme who worked closely with our creative and production team to curate the audience experience. Through weekly content sessions and the opportunity to assist during Learning Contributor sessions, our Young Curators and Consultants were able to learn about curation whilst developing their creative and collaborative skills.















### **Speak Your Truth**

In Collaboration with our community partner the Beth Centre (Women in Prison), a cohort was created to curate and design a new festival, which took place in August 2024 at the community space Draper Hall. The festival was inspired by Taking Part's 2024 provocation 'Investing In Our Neighbourhoods' and the Beth Centre's theme of Wellness.

This cohort was made up of clients and advocates of the Beth Centre led by lead artist Kelechi Okafor and filmmaker Bukola Bakinson. The group were tasked to make a festival line up which responds to the four key frameworks: Workshops, discussion, performance and celebration. The Cohort did not only curate the festival; they were also tasked with creating a 3 minute performance speech each about any topic they care about. This was coached and directed by Kelechi Okafor, and performed as a part of the event 'free up yourself'.

The aim of the project was to empower the women to feel more confident in their voice and learn key skills in festival curation and event management.



### **Creators Program**

### **Supporting the Next Generation of Artists**

The Creators Program is a unique offering at the Young Vic, dedicated to supporting early and mid-career theatre makers and producers.

At its heart, the internationally renowned network provides talented individuals with the space, resources and paid professional opportunities to develop their craft. The Program is vital to the UK theatre ecology, providing artists with pathways to flourish, often going from subsidised theatre into the West End, television and film.






#### The Earthworks

Directed by Andrea Ling and written by Tom Morton-Smith, The Earthworks explored humanity's relationship with nature and the environment, tackling the theme of climate change through a multidisciplinary lens.

This production provided an opportunity for emerging theatre-makers to engage in a socially relevant narrative, using innovative staging and visual storytelling



#### **Genesis Future Directors Award**

A paid opportunity to direct a fully supported production in the Clare Theatre.

The Genesis Future Directors Award enables us to identify, support and nurture a director to explore their craft and stage a production in the Clare Studio.

Annie Kershaw is the recipient of the Young Vic's 2024 Genesis Future Directors Award.

Annie is currently the Carne Deputy Director at Jermyn Street Theatre. She was Associate Director on Best of Enemies in the West End and previously the Jerwood Assistant Director at the Young Vic.

#### **New Partnerships**

The Creators Program teamed up with Black Lives in Music for 'Introduction to Making for Musical Directors'.


Focused on addressing the underrepresentation of Black and Global Majority Musical Directors (MDs) in the British theatre industry, our project aims to provide opportunities for professional musicians interested in learning or refining their skills in musical direction through a series of free events.



#### **Girl In The Machine**

Directed by Annie Kershaw, the recipient of the Genesis Future Directors Award 2024, this electrifying production of Stef Smith's award-winning play explored the tension between love and technology.

As Polly grapples with her relationship with Rowen and the allure of the Black Box, audiences are invited to consider the implications of a fast-changing world. The production featured BAFTA-nominated Leah Harvey and Sophie Melville.



## Looking Ahead Nadia Fall's Artistic Leadership

We are excited to welcome Nadia Fall as our new Artistic Director. Nadia joins us from Theatre Royal Stratford East, where she championed innovative programming and community engagement.

At Stratford East, her programming highlights include a hit revival of Equus which transferred to the West End in her first season, August Wilson's King Hedley II starring Sir Lenny Henry which she also directed, and new collaborations including a large-scale production of Noye's Fludde with English National Opera, bringing together 300 young people and which received the Olivier Award for Outstanding Achievement in Opera.

#### Glenn Earle, Chair of the Board, said:

"I am thrilled that Nadia will join us as our next Artistic Director ... Nadia has a proven and long-standing record not only of theatre leadership, but also of significant artistic success, at the National Theatre, at Stratford East and as a freelance director. Critically, Nadia also shares our core Young Vic values of commitment to community and to broadening access to theatre and creative education.

My fellow Board members and I look forward to the exciting next chapter of the Young Vic story under the leadership of Nadia, who we are sure will build confidently, creatively and inclusively on the extraordinary legacy of their illustrious forebears. "


