IMAGES FROM THE REHEARSAL ROOM: RUTH WILSON IN 24-HOUR SHOW THE SECOND WOMAN



Rehearsal images are released today of **Ruth Wilson** in the UK premiere of the internationally acclaimed *The Second Woman*, an epic 24-hour performance at the **Young Vic Theatre**, created and directed by **Nat Randall and Anna Breckon**, co-produced with LIFT, commencing on Friday 19 May, at 4pm.

The Second Woman is produced in association with **Ruth Wilson**, presented in proud association with **House of Oz.**

One woman, one scene, one hundred men, one electrifying 24-hour performance.

Over a full 24 hours, 100 different men, non-binary and queer people will star opposite **Ruth Wilson** as she performs over and over a scene between a man and a woman in a relationship that has lost its creativity and romance.

In an epic endurance performance inspired by John Cassavetes' film *Opening Night*, none of the 100 different Martys have met or rehearsed with **Ruth Wilson**'s Virginia and most of them are non-actors.

This production, created and directed by **Anna Breckon and Nat Randall**, is a collaboration between **LIFT** and the **Young Vic**, bringing together two of London's most innovative cultural institutions with one of the world's most celebrated actors.

Whether you choose to stay for 24 minutes or the full 24 hours, *The Second Woman* is a unique, cinematic theatre experience in which the stage offers the audience a wide-angle view of the action, while multiple cameras capture and share live close-ups.

About the Young Vic Theatre

Founded in 1970 as a space for world-premiere productions and unexpected takes on classic plays that speak urgently to our present, the Young Vic Theatre has been one of London's leading theatres for more than fifty years.

Welcoming more than 100,000 visitors a year to its London Waterloo location, the Young Vic stands out in the city's cultural landscape for balancing daring commercial drive, success and artistic flair with genuine grassroots social impact change in our neighbourhood. We forge deep connections in our neighbourhood through our Taking Part programme, where we engage with over 15,000 people every year via a wide range of projects, from skills-based workshops to on-stage performances. We give 10% of our tickets free to schools and neighbours, irrespective of box office demand, and we are committed to keeping ticket prices low.

The Young Vic's Creators Program is our space for multi- and anti-disciplinary artists, and is the only scheme of its kind. Launched in 2001, and formerly known as the Directors Program, we offer artists and producers a unique opportunity to develop their craft through opportunities that range from trainee and assistant director roles to a two-year residency through the Genesis Fellow/Associate Director position. The Genesis Network provides an online

community to over 2,000 artists and producers. Each year, the recipient of the Genesis Future Directors Award directs a show in the Clare Theatre with full support from the Young Vic team.

Built upon the principles of access, innovation, and community, the Young Vic is deepening its roots nationally and internationally. Recent productions in the West End and on Broadway include: Best of Enemies at the Noël Coward Theatre and Rodgers & Hammerstein's *Oklahoma!* at Wyndham's Theatre; and on Broadway, *Death of a Salesman* at the Hudson Theatre and *The Collaboration* at Manhattan Theatre Club's Samuel J. Friedman Theatre.

The Young Vic's founding spirit is iconoclastic and pushing at the forefront of possibility, bringing together artists and audiences on a global scale and using the power of stories to change our world.
