## About the Young Vic Theatre

You are visiting the Young Vic Theatre.

The Young Vic Theatre is near Waterloo and Southwark underground stations



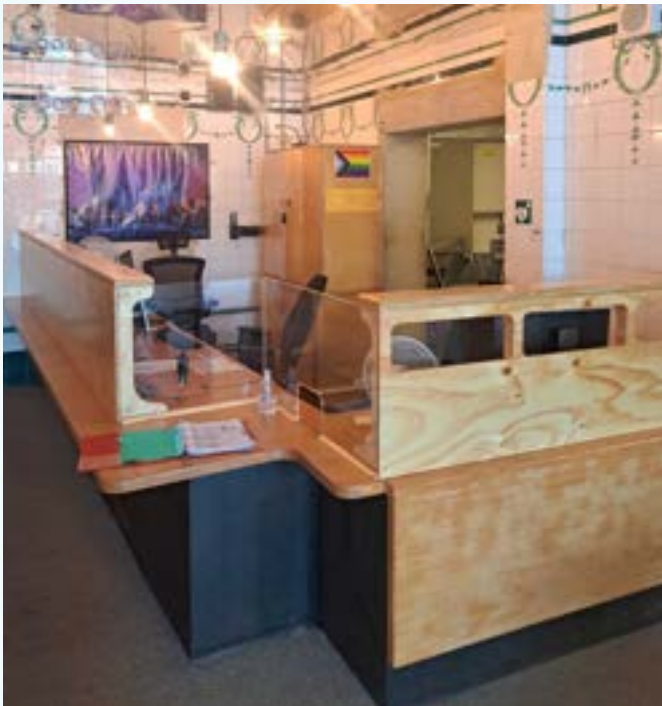
The front of the theatre looks like this. The entrance is step-free.



There may be a lot of people outside of the theatre before a show, and you may have to wait in a queue to get inside.



# Young Vic



When you first enter the building, you will see the Box Office.

Here you can:

- Collect paper tickets
- Pick up ear defenders, fidget toys, and hearing loops
- Ask for assistance and find out where to go



On the left is the entrance to the bar and restaurant. It is sometimes busy and noisy here.

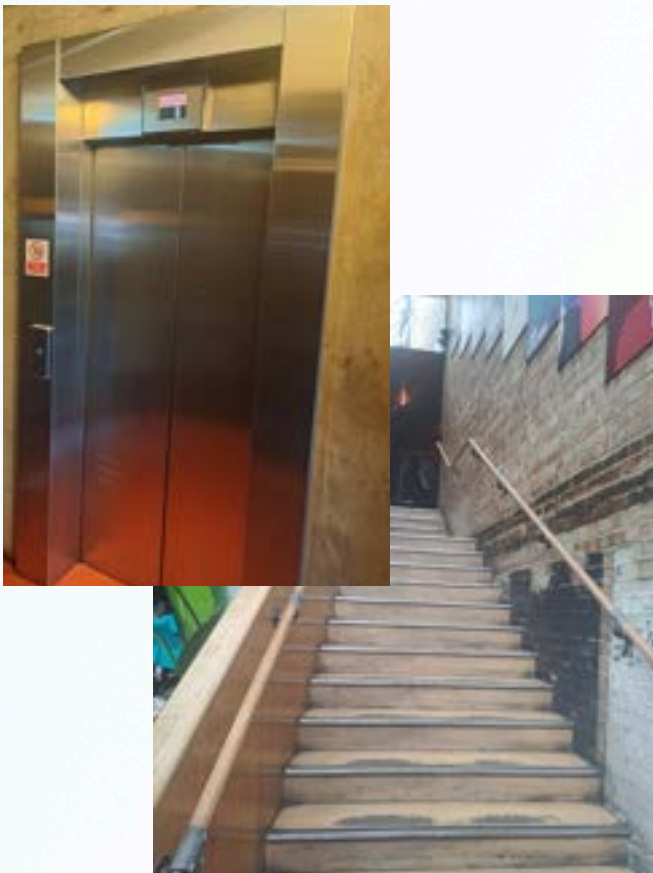

# Young Vic



At the back of the bar are the toilets. These are split into "Men" and "Women". There are also accessible toilets. You might have to queue for the toilets. There are more toilets upstairs.



You can access the first floor by stairs or lift. There are 16 steps in total. There is another bar and more toilets upstairs including an accessible toilet. The toilets upstairs are gender neutral.



# Young Vic



At the top of the stairs on the right is the "Marie McKenna Room". This room functions as our "Chill Out Space" which is open during Relaxed performances.



Inside the Chill Out Space will be:

- Comfy chairs
- Weighted blankets
- Ear defenders
- A variety of fidget toys

You can go to the Chill Out Space anytime you need a break or want to be somewhere quiet.

# About The Maria Theatre

Ohio is in The Maria Theatre.

You can enter The Maria Theatre through the main door or a side door from the front of the building. Both doors have step-free access.

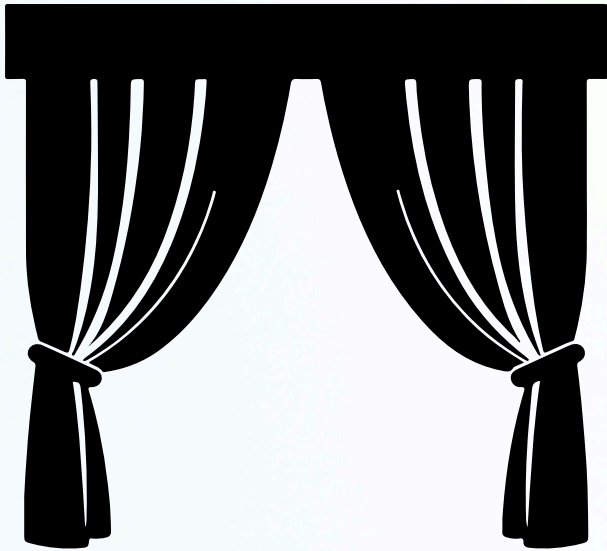
If entering through the main door, the entrance to The Maria theatre is at the back of the bar on the right.



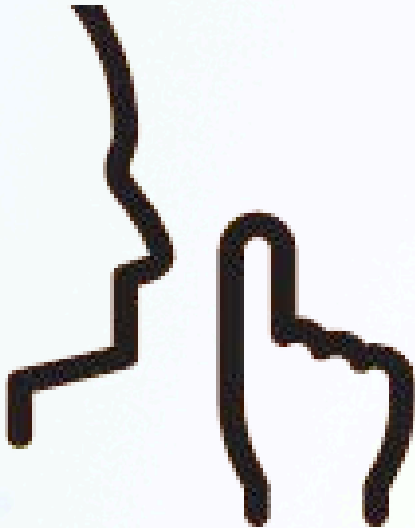
This is what

When you get to the doors, a member of staff in a red t-shirt or hoodie called an usher will scan your ticket. Seats are unreserved, so you can sit anywhere.

# The Show



The show will be 90 minutes long with no interval.



When it is time for the show to start, the theatre will get darker and everyone will be quiet.

During the Relaxed performance on Tuesday 14 October, you can make noise and move around as you need to.



This whole show will have integrated captions on a screen at the back of the stage.

If you want to read the captions during the show, check you can see them from your seat. If not, ask an usher to help you move seats.



The show will have loud music and moments with loud ringing sounds throughout. You can use ear defenders if the show ever gets too loud. You can get ear defenders from the Box Office before the show

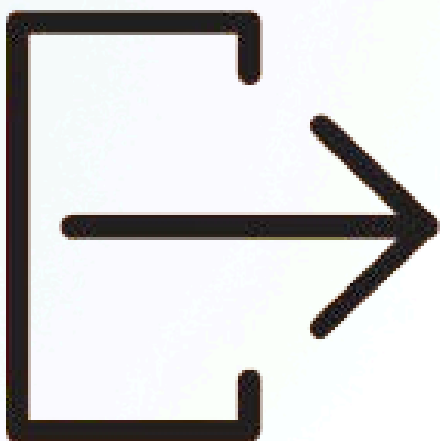




You can leave to go to the Chill Out Space at any point. If you're not sure how to get there, you can ask an usher and they'll be happy to help.



At the end of the show, people will clap. Some people may stand up to show the actors that they liked the show.



After the show is over, you will leave the theatre. You might not leave the same way that you came in.
