

A MESSAGE FROM TIM CROUCH



Twenty years ago in a room above a pub in south London an experiment took place. Actors were invited to try out a new play called An Oak Tree - like trying out a new drug formulation. Each

time a different actor who knew nothing about the play they were going to be in -a blind test each time. On the last night of this Young Vic run, that experiment will have been performed 400 times with 400 different actors. There's no definitive version. Each performance is a fraction of its whole; the last night here will be 1/400th of the idea of the show. It resists completion. No results. There's just this one. Which will be different to that one. And so on.
